## IV. FIRE AND EXPLOSION DATA

**VI. HEALTH HAZARD DATA**

**EYE CONTACT:** Exposure to high vapor concentrations or contact with liquid causes tearing and severe irritation. Contact with liquid causes severe burns.

**SKIN CONTACT:** Liquid causes drying, cracking and scaling. Repeated contact causes hardening of the skin and may cause dermatitis and sensitization.

**INHALATION:** Causes irritation to nose, throat and respiratory tract. Bronchopneumonia and edema possible from breathing high concentrations.

**INGESTION:** May be fatal if swallowed. Severe inflammation of mouth, throat or stomach. Blurring of vision or blindness may occur.

**EMERGENCY AND FIRST AID:**

**EYE CONTACT:** Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Call a physician.

**SKIN CONTACT:** Immediately flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Remove contaminated clothing and shoes. Wash clothing before reuse. Call a physician.

**INHALATION:** Remove to fresh air. If not breathing give artificial respiration, then oxygen if necessary. Call a physician.

**INGESTION:** Induce vomiting immediately by giving two glasses of water and sticking finger down throat. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Immediately call a physician.

**VII. SPILL AND DISPOSAL INFORMATION**

**SPILL OR LEAK:** Ventilate area thoroughly - avoid breathing of vapor. Absorb liquid with vermiculite or dry earth. Flush area with plenty of water.

**WASTE DISPOSAL:** Dispose of residue in compliance with Federal, State and local regulations.

**VIII. PROTECTION INFORMATION:**

Respiratory Protection: Ventilation should be adequate to keep exposure limits below the Action Level (CFR 29 1910.1048) of 0.50 ppm. If limits are exceeded, a full-face NIOSH approved respirator should be used.

Ventilation: Local exhaust should be adequate to control exposure.

Eye Protection: Gas proof Goggles and Face Shield recommended.

Protective Gloves: Neoprene, Butyl or Polyvinyl Gloves.

**IX. SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS:**

Keep containers closed. Store in cool, well-ventilated area away from open flame. Do not breathe vapor. Avoid prolonged or repeated contact with skin. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling.
